The Covenant and the Sacrament

As I type these words, I am also preparing a sermon around the Baptism of Jesus. In this story, although he is the actual Messiah, Christ Jesus requests the sacrament of baptism by his cousin, John. John points out that this seems sort of backward. Jesus answers, “Let it be so now, for it is proper for us in this way to fulfill all righteousness.”

Baptism is the great equalizer. In the United Church of Christ, Baptism is one of only two sacraments, and it represents the forming of a covenant, or set of promises. In an infant baptism, the candidate's parents promise to raise them in the church, the church promises to spiritually support the candidate, and we pray and read scripture to invoke God's promise to be present in all of it.

Although I was baptized in a different church, I have never felt more held and supported by covenantal bonds than here, at Ripley United Church of Christ. Just in the past year, you have walked with me through marriage, a major surgery, the deaths of both of my parents, and the deployment of my oldest son to a war zone. You have shown grace when I needed it, and held me accountable when I needed that too. I cannot imagine a better church home as member or as pastor, and I truly hope that everyone who walks through our doors comes to feel the same way.

If we at Ripley can be better covenantal partners for you—baptized or not—please reach out. If we can pray for you, tell us what to pray for. If we can help connect you to resources, let us know your needs. And as always, if you find yourself in need of beloved community, we are here.

As we at Ripley are so fond of saying, “no matter who you are, or where you are on life's journey, you are welcome here.”

Ripley UCC Missions...







were married at the hometown church in 1987 and the whole family enjoys worship there when visiting.

Can you believe it has been three years since "Soul Stitching" was started?

On the 2nd Saturday of every month, those who stitch at Ripley gather when the doors open at 9am to the Fellowship Hall. A potluck lunch and fellowship over a quilt is enjoyed.

You know it is a small world when you stitch and find out the person beside you was a part of your child's youth in FFA. When you can hold a newborn so that your friend can tie and be a part of the Mission. When your friends over 400 miles away are aware of the Mission in little Traer IA .

All because of those who stitch at Ripley. On Thursdays—at Soul Stitching. With the financial support of Ripley Missions Committee and donations from the surrounding community, those who stitch have made over 300 quilts, burp cloths, wheelchair caddies and dog beds in 2025.

Because of those who stitch, donations of these items have been given to Tama Co Storks Nest, Sleep in Heavenly Peace in IA & IN.
